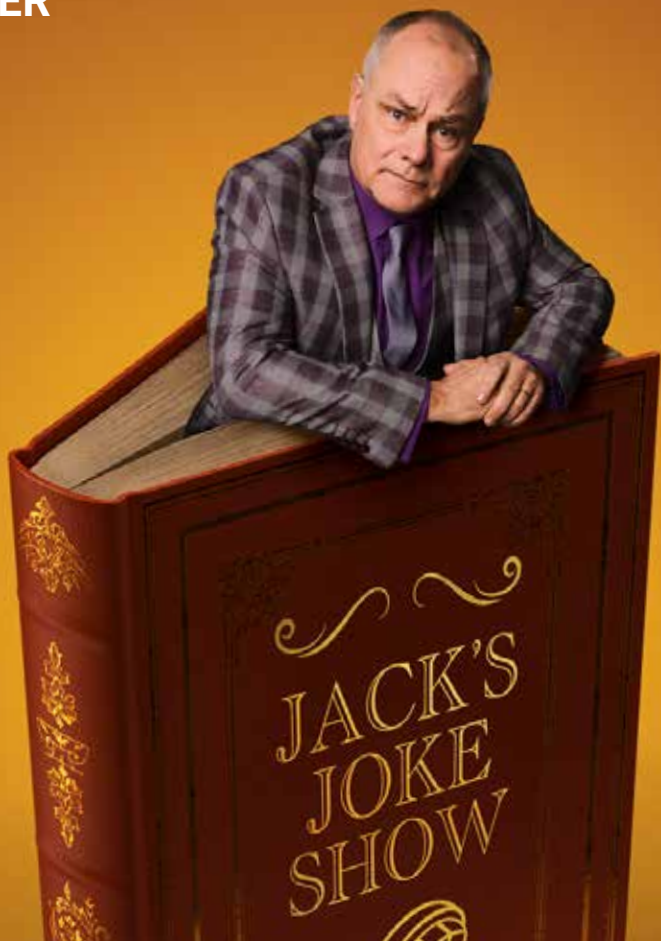

The venue and the Box Office open one hour before the scheduled start time for evening events.

Online bookings can be made through our website 24/7. For online bookings the ticketing company (TicketSource) charge 7% of the ticket price with a 50p minimum charge. There is no booking fee when you contact our Box Office directly.

GETTING TO THE VENUE



The Exchange cannot accommodate parking for audience members and there is no parking on the Brewery Wharf estate. There are limited parking spaces near the venue for Blue Badge holders. There are public car parks in Twickenham within walking distance of the venue. We encourage audience members to travel by public transport when possible. We are located directly opposite Twickenham railway station and bus routes 267, 281 and H22 pass outside the venue.

CONCESSIONS

Concessions are indicated where available. We offer concessions to children under the age of 16, adults aged 60+, students in full-time education, St Mary's University staff, those on income support and registered disabled. Proof of status must be shown when booking or collecting tickets.

REFUNDS

The Exchange regrets it is unable to refund tickets unless the performance is postponed or cancelled.

ACCESSIBILITY

The Exchange is committed to making the venue accessible to everyone so they can enjoy the whole programme. For accessible seating advice, please call our Box Office prior to your visit so we can accommodate your needs.

There are limited parking spaces near the venue for Blue Badge holders.

We have step free access from the street to the Box Office/ground floor of the building. The Exchange has lift access to all levels of the building. Accessible toilets are on the ground level, 2nd and 4th floors. In the theatre Row J is step free, the aisle seats are J4, 5, 23, 24.

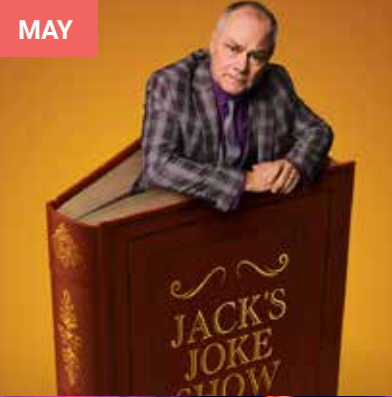

RICHMOND FILM SOCIETY

Richmond Film Society was formed in 1963 and has since screened around 900 films. Its objective was, and remains, to bring our community the very best in World Cinema. THIS SEASON

I'M STILL HERE (BRAZIL)

Tuesday 7 April | 8 pm | Running time: 137 minutes

Based on the real-life story of activist Eunice Paiva (Fernanda Torres), whose husband was abducted by Brazil's military dictatorship in 1971, *I'm Still Here* is a powerful depiction of life under the military junta and the impact of 'the disappeared' on their families. Directed by Walter Salles (Central Station, The Motorbike Diaries).

GOOD ONE (USA)

Tuesday 21 April | 8 pm | Running time: 90 minutes

During a three-day backpacking trip in the Catskills, 17-year-old Sam navigates a clash of egos between her father (now embarked on a second family, with a new, much younger wife) and his oldest friend, Matt, enduring their petty disputes and selfishness. When an awkward campfire encounter between Sam and Matt ruptures the trip, it casts the trio's relationships in a new, ugly light. A film of quiet intelligence and emotional depth.

THERE IS NO EVIL (IRAN)

Tuesday 5 May | 8 pm | Running time: 150 minutes

A polemic on the death penalty in Iran, told through four stories. The focus is not on the question of whether capital punishment can be justified, but on the moral difficulties of those who keep the system running or who are forced to do so. Every country that enforces the death penalty needs people to kill other people and, in *There Is No Evil*, four men are confronted with an unthinkable but simple choice.

THE SERVANT (UK)

Tuesday 19 May | 8 pm | Running time: 116 minutes

RFS' British Classic for Season 62 is *The Servant*, written by Harold Pinter (who adapted Robin Maugham's 1948 novella) and directed by Joseph Losey. A sinister, psychological drama in which a manservant (Dirk Bogarde) manipulates his master (James Fox).

VERMIGLIO (ITALY)

Tuesday 2 June | 8 pm | Running time: 119 minutes

Set in 1944 Vermiglio, a high mountain village in the Italian Alps, war looms as a distant but constant threat. The arrival of Pietro, a refugee soldier, disrupts the dynamics of the local teacher's family, changing them forever.

RADICAL (MEXICO)

Tuesday 16 June | 8 pm | Running time: 126 minutes

Sixth grade pupils in a border town are among the worst performing students in Mexico, with their world one of neglect, violence, corruption and hardship. It seems like a dead end, but it's the perfect place for a new teacher to deploy unorthodox methods to break through his student's apathy and motivate them to think for themselves.

THE ORIGIN OF EVIL (FRANCE)

Tuesday 30 June | 8 pm | Running time: 123 minutes

RFS's summer film is the slow-burning and, at times, darkly comedic, French thriller, *The Origin of Evil*. When a financially distressed factory worker, Stéphane (Laure Calamy of *Call My Agent!*), gets in touch with wealthy Serge, announcing that she is his long-abandoned, illegitimate daughter.

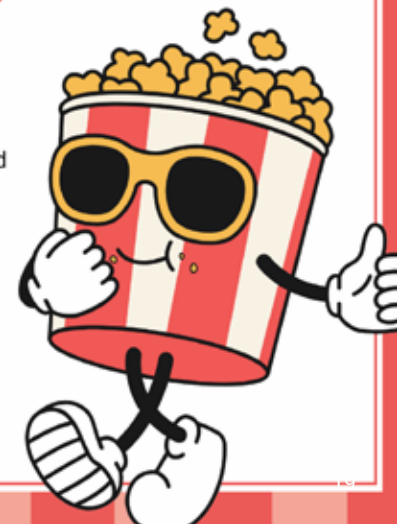
